A message from Rev. Agron Moad

# Good morning

In our reading this morning Mark 2:1-12 we read about Jesus miraculously healing a paralysed man this passage teaches us about the nature of faith, compassion, and the transformative power of experiencing the presence of Jesus. The story unfolds as Jesus and his small band of disciples return to Capernaum, and word spreads rapidly that that Jesus is home. Soon, a huge crowd gathers, eager to witness his teachings and experience his healing touch. Among them is a group of friends carrying a paralysed friend on a mat. Faced with the impossibility of getting their friend through the crowded entrance, they display remarkable ingenuity and faith by lowering him through the roof to bring him into Jesus' presence.

The first thing that we notice is the determination of this group to have their friend healed. They do not let anything stop them from reaching their goal. Their faith is not passive but active, motivating them to look for Jesus with unwavering conviction. This act of communal support and solidarity exemplifies the power of friendship and the importance of standing by one another in times of need.

When Jesus sees their faith, he responds with compassion and authority, declaring to the paralysed man, "Son, your sins are forgiven." This statement perplexes the scribes, who question Jesus' authority to forgive sins. Jesus worked on the biggest issue first, salvation, he forgave the man dealing with his spiritual



needs. The Scribes were correct only God has the authority to forgive sins In response to the Scribes questioning, Jesus performs a tangible miracle, instructing the man to rise, take up his mat, and walk. Instantly, the man is healed, and he walks out before the astonished crowd. This reveals the identity of Jesus, he has authority over physical ailments but more important he shows that he is God by forgiving the man of his sins. The significance of this event extends beyond the physical realm. It serves as a profound revelation of Jesus' identity as the Son of God and the embodiment of divine grace and mercy.

This passage challenges us to reflect on our own faith and the barriers that may hinder our spiritual journey. Are we willing to exhibit the same level of faith and determination as the paralysed man's friends? Do we believe in the transformative power of encountering Jesus in our lives, even in the midst of challenges and uncertainties? As we reflect on Mark 2:1-12, let us be inspired by the example of the paralysed man and his friends. Let us develop a faith that is bold, persistent, and unwavering, trusting in the healing and redemptive power of Christ. May we also be reminded of our call to extend compassion and support to people in need, bearing one another's burdens and sharing in the journey of faith together.
