A message from Rev. Aaron Moad

Good morning

As we begin our journey through the season of Lent, we are called to reflect deeply on our faith, our relationship with God, and our commitment to living lives that honour His will. This week, our Scripture reading from Matthew 3:13-4:11 presents us with an account of Jesus' baptism and his temptation in the wilderness. In this passage, we witness Jesus, after his baptism by John the Baptist, being led by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil.

It's important to know that temptation itself is not a sin. In our human experience, we will undoubtedly encounter moments of temptation, where we are enticed by desires or distractions that may lead us away from God's path. So, we mustn't feel guilty of being tempted, even Jesus, in his humanity, faced temptation. What really matters is our response to the temptation, and the choices we make in the face of temptation.

Jesus' response to temptation serves as a powerful example for us. In the face of temptation, he relied on his understanding of the Scriptures, stating, "It is written: 'Man shall not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God.'" (Matthew 4:4) Jesus draws strength from Scripture, demonstrating the importance of knowing and understanding Scripture as a shield against temptation.

Jesus' resistance to temptation was not merely a matter of willpower but stemmed from his unwavering commitment to Father's will. Each time the devil tempted him, Jesus responded with a firm affirmation of his faithfulness to God

the Father. He declared, "Away from me, Satan! For it is written: 'Worship the Lord your God and serve him only.'" (Matthew 4:10) Jesus remained steadfast in his devotion to God, refusing to succumb to the allure of worldly temptations.

As we reflect on Jesus' experience in the wilderness, we are reminded that temptation is an inevitable part of our human experience. However, we are not left defenceless in the face of temptation. Through prayer, the study of Scripture, and a steadfast commitment to God, we can resist temptation and remain faithful to His will. However when we do sin we can rely on the Grace of God and what Jesus did through his life, death, and resurrection that if we are repentant and ask we will be forgiven.

During this season of Lent, let us take time to examine our lives and identify areas where we are vulnerable to temptation. Let us immerse ourselves in prayer and Bible study, seeking strength and guidance from God to overcome temptation. Let's also remember that we are not alone in our struggle against temptation; God is with us, ready to provide us with the strength and grace we need to resist.

May this Lenten season be a time of spiritual renewal and growth as we seek to draw closer to God and live lives that reflect His love and grace.
