# A message from Rev. Aaron Moad

Good morning,

Today's readings Isaiah 6:1-8 and Mark 1:14-20, are about the transformative call to discipleship.

In Isaiah 6:1-8, we witness the prophet Isaiah's aweinspiring encounter with the holiness of God. In the year that King Uzziah died, Isaiah found himself in the presence of the God, surrounded worshiped by a type of angel called seraphim who declared "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory." This encounter was not just an amazing sight; it was a life-altering encounter that brought Isaiah to his knees, recognizing his own unworthiness in the presence of God.

When God asked, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" Isaiah did not hesitate he replied, "Here am I; send me!" He showed a heart that was eager and prepared to follow God's call. He didn't make excuses or ask for more details. He simply trusted God and offered himself as a servant. This passage reminds us that when we truly encounter the holiness of God, it should stir within us a willingness to respond to His call, even if it means stepping out of our comfort zones.

In Mark 1:14-20, we find Jesus calling of his first disciples. Jesus has just returned from 40 days of fasting and being tempted in the wilderness to the news of John's arrest. John's ministry has ended, and Jesus has begun his ministry, declaring, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent and believe in the gospel." In response to this divine call, Simon and Andrew, James, and John, left their fishing nets to follow Jesus.



Their response was immediate. Like Isaiah, these fishermen didn't hesitate; they left behind their livelihoods and families to start a journey of discipleship. Jesus' call was not only an invitation to follow but also an invitation to participate in the redemptive work of God's kingdom.

In the intersection of these two passages from Isaiah and Mark, we find a common thread – the encounter with the holiness of God and the subsequent call to discipleship. Just as Isaiah responded with "Here am I; send me!" and the disciples left their nets to follow Jesus. Just like Isaiah and the disciples we're called to respond to the divine call on our lives to actively engage in the work of God's kingdom.

As Christian's and as a community of faith we always stand at a crossroad, a moment where we are invited to deepen our relationship with God and embrace our calling as disciples. Let's seek those divine encounters, whether in moments of worship, prayer, or reflection on Scripture. May we be willing, like Isaiah, to say, "Here am I; send me!" and, like the disciples, to leave behind the familiar, comfortable and safe to follow the call of Christ.

As we journey together in faith, may the Holy Spirit empower and guide us. Let's be a community known for our willingness to respond to God's call, to love one another, and to share the love of God and the transformative message of the gospel our neighbours.
