A message from Rev. Aaron Moad

Good morning,

In today's gospel reading Mark 1:29-39, we read about a day in the life of Jesus. We notice that any given day in Jesus' life is filled with compassion, healing, and a profound sense of purpose. This particular day is the Sabbath, we read that Jesus leaves the synagogue in Capernaum, he and the disciples go to Simon's and Andrew's house. Jesus sees that Simon's mother in law is unwell with a fever. Mark's account is simple but powerful, it shows Jesus' immediate response to the needs of the people around Him. He takes Simon's mother in law by the hand, lifts her up, and the fever leaves her. In this simple act, we find a profound message – Jesus is not just a distant deity, like the Roman gods but he is a compassionate healer reaching out to us wanting to be involved in our lives.

The healing of Simon's mother in law is a small example that mirrors Jesus' whole ministry. His touch brings not only physical healing but also restores Simon's mother in law to wholeness, this is what Jesus came to do to the world. As we reflect on this passage, let us consider the areas in our lives where we need Jesus' healing touch, trusting that He is present and eager to restore us.

The news of Jesus' healing spreads like wildfire, and soon it seems like the entire city gathers at the door, bringing with them the sick and demon possessed. Imagine the scene, a huge crowd coming to witness the healing power of Jesus. In this passage we see the selfless compassion that flows from Jesus. He heals the sick and casts out demons, demonstrating His authority over both physical and spiritual afflictions.

As dawn breaks, the city is silent, but Jesus is not. The next scene takes us to a solitary place where Jesus retreats for



prayer. In the midst of His bustling ministry, Jesus prioritises communion with the Father over sleep. This serves as a powerful reminder for us to carve out moments of solitude and prayer in our busy lives, seeking God's guidance, strength, and renewal. If it's good for Jesus it must be good for us.

Simon and others search for Jesus, and when they find Him, they tell Jesus about the overwhelming demand for His presence back in the city. Yet, Jesus responds with a profound declaration: "Let us go on to the neighbouring towns, so that I may proclaim the message there also; for that is what I came out to do." Jesus understood His mission – to proclaim the Kingdom of God. His ministry was not confined to a single location but extended to every town and village.

Our reading challenges us to consider the scope of our own mission as followers of Christ. Are we limiting the reach of God's love to our immediate circles, or are we compelled to share the God's love with people beyond our comfort zones? Jesus' example encourages us to broaden our horizons and share the transformative message of His love with the world.

Mark 1:29-39 reveals a day in the life of Jesus marked by compassion, healing, prayer, and a clear sense of purpose. As we navigate our own faith journey, let's imitate Christ's compassion, prioritise prayer, and embrace the expansive mission to share the Gospel with all. May the Holy Spirit guide us in our endeavours, and may our lives be a reflection of the love and grace of Christ.
