# A message from Rev. Agron Moad

# Good morning

As we continue our journey through the season of Lent, we are called to reflect deeply on our faith, our actions, and our relationship with God. In John 2:13-22, we read about an important moment in the Jesus' ministry – the cleansing of the temple. This event serves as a poignant reminder of the importance of reverence, purity, and dedication in our worship and in our lives.

In this passage, we see Jesus coming into the temple courts and finding them filled with merchants and moneychangers. Rather than a sacred space of prayer and worship, the temple had been turned into a marketplace, where commerce overshadowed the solemnity of devotion.

Filled with righteous indignation, Jesus overturns the tables and drives out the merchants, declaring, "Stop turning my Father's house into a market!" (John 2:16). His actions are not simply acts of anger or disruption; they are symbolic gestures of cleansing and restoration. Jesus is reclaiming the sacred space of the temple and restoring its intended purpose as a place of reverence and communion with God.

This act of cleansing the temple challenges us to examine our own hearts and the state of our spiritual lives. Are we treating our places of worship with the reverence they deserve, or have



they become spaces of convenience and consumerism? Do we approach God with sincerity and humility, or do we allow distractions and worldly concerns to take precedence?

As we continue our journey through Lent, let's take this opportunity to cleanse our own temples – the temples of our hearts. Let us rid ourselves of anything that hinders our relationship with God, whether it be selfish desires, material attachments, or spiritual complacency. Let's cultivate a spirit of devotion, prayer, and repentance, turning away from sin and turning toward the abundant grace and mercy of our loving God.

Ultimately, the cleansing of the temple foreshadows the ultimate sacrifice of Jesus on the cross – the sacrifice that cleanses us from sin and reconciles us to God. As we prepare to commemorate this sacrifice during the Easter season, may we open our hearts to the transformative power of God's love, allowing it to purify us and renew our commitment to following Christ.

May this Lenten season continue to be a time of deep spiritual reflection and renewal for each of us, as we strive to live faithfully in the footsteps of our Lord and Saviour.
