# A message from Rev. Aaron Moad

# Good morning

As we continue our journey through Lent, a time of reflection, repentance, and spiritual growth, we are called to delve deeper into the transformative power of Christ's love and sacrifice. This season offers us an opportunity to draw closer to God, to examine our lives, and to prepare our hearts to receive the profound message of Easter.

In Mark 9:2-9, we read about the extraordinary account of Jesus' transfiguration.
