A message from Rev. Aaron Moad

From Comfort to Commitment: Following Jesus Without Looking Back

We all want to live lives that matter—to wake up each day with a sense of purpose, direction, and meaning. But when following Jesus starts to challenge our routines or push us outside our comfort zones, it can be tempting to pause, hesitate, or even step back.

In today's reading from Luke 9:51–62, we see Jesus on a mission. The passage tells us He "set His face" toward Jerusalem. He knew what was coming—rejection, opposition, suffering, the cross—and He didn't turn away. He moved forward with boldness, focus, and love. And then, along the way, He invites others to follow Him. But His invitation isn't a soft sell. He's honest: following Him is costly, and it won't always be comfortable. This week's passage gives us three big takeaways about what it really means to follow Jesus with our whole hearts:

1. Jesus Doesn't Promise Comfort—He Offers a Deeper Purpose

When someone says, "I'll follow you wherever you go," Jesus replies, "Foxes have holes and birds have nests, but the Son of Man has no place to lay His head." (Luke 9:58)
In other words, don't expect an easy ride. Jesus didn't live a life

of luxury or security. And if we're serious about following Him, we might be called to let go of comfort, convenience, or control. But what He offers in return is far better—a life of purpose, love, and transformation.

What might Jesus be inviting you to let go of so you can follow Him more freely?

2. Delayed Obedience Is Still Disobedience

To another person, Jesus says, "Follow me." But the man replies, "Lord, first let me go and bury my father." Sounds reasonable, right? But Jesus' answer is striking: "Let the dead bury their own dead. You go and proclaim the kingdom of God."

This isn't about being insensitive—it's about urgency. Jesus is saying, don't put off the call of God. There will always be a reason



to wait—bad timing, fear—but following Jesus means saying "yes" today, not someday.

What excuses have been keeping you from stepping fully into God's calling?

3. You Can't Move Forward if You're Always Looking Back

Another person says, "I'll follow you, Lord, but first let me go back and say goodbye to my family." Again, Jesus replies with a challenge: "No one who puts a hand to the plough and looks back is fit for service in the kingdom of God."

Jesus isn't saying we can't love our families—He's calling out divided hearts. When we're always glancing back—whether it's to old habits, regrets, or past comforts—it's hard to move forward in faith. Jesus calls us to fix our eyes on Him and not turn back.

What are you still holding onto that might be slowing you down?

So What Now?

Jesus doesn't sugarcoat it—following Him is a serious, life-changing decision. But it's also the best decision we could ever make. He isn't calling us to perfection—just to faith, surrender, and commitment.

This week, take some time to ask yourself:

- Am I following Jesus out of convenience or conviction?
- Where might I be hesitating instead of moving forward?
- What step is Jesus asking me to take right now?

Remember:

You're not alone in this journey.
Jesus has already walked the hard road ahead of you.
And He's still saying, "Follow me."
