A message from Rev. Aaron Moad

Here I Am - Send Me

In our readings from Isaiah 6:1-8 and Luke 10:1-11, 16-20, we witness extraordinary moments of calling and sending. Isaiah experiences an awesome vision of God in heaven. And in the Gospel According to Luke, we find Jesus calling and sending out the seventy-two disciples to bring peace, healing, and the good news of the kingdom to a world in desperate need. Both of these passages remind us of something vital: God still calls, and God still sends.

In Isaiah's case, he's overwhelmed by the glory of God. In Luke, the disciples are overwhelmed by the harvest, the need, and also the joy of ministry. Both texts remind us: as followers of Christ we are people who are sent. But even more, we are people who are *accompanied*. God doesn't just call us and send us out on our own—He goes with us, strengthens us, and equips us for the work ahead.

Whether you feel ready or not, God has work for you to do—but not alone, with support from others, and always with the Spirit's help.

This week's passage gives us three life transforming truths:

1. God reveals Himself in holiness and love.

Isaiah's vision in the temple is powerful. He sees God, high and exalted, with heavenly beings crying out, "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord Almighty!" It's overwhelming. Isaiah feels completely unworthy, and his first reaction when he sees the glory of God isn't worship—it's fear. "Woe is me! I am ruined!" he cries out. But God doesn't leave him in fear. A seraph touches his lips with a coal not as a punishment but to cleanse him.

This is how God works. He doesn't just show us His greatness to intimidate us—He reveals His holiness so we might see our need and for His healing love. God says, "Your guilt is taken away." Grace steps in where shame tried to stay.

2. God sends ordinary people with an extraordinary mission.

In Luke 10, Jesus appoints seventy-two disciples—to go out ahead of Him. They aren't told to be perfect, or to have all the answers.



They're simply sent in trust. These were ordinary people. They weren't scholars or spiritual giants, but Jesus believed in them enough to entrust them with His mission. That same mission is extended to *us*—to show up, to be present, to bring hope, to bring peace, and tell everybody the good news of Jesus wherever we go.

In both readings, the call comes not to the most qualified but to ordinary people who are willing. You may not feel like you're enough, you may feel unworthy, you may feel unqualified but remember: God doesn't call the equipped; He equips the called. Isaiah says "Here I am, send me." And that's enough because when we say yes God takes responsibility for the rest.

3. Joy comes from belonging, not just doing.

When the seventy-two return, they're thrilled. "Even the demons submit to us in your name!" they say. But Jesus gently redirects them: "Do not rejoice that the spirits submit to you, but rejoice that your names are written in heaven."

It's easy to find our joy in results or recognition, but Jesus reminds us that our deepest joy comes from relationship—from belonging to Him. What you do matters, but who you are to God matters even more. You are His beloved, and that is worth celebrating.

So What Now?

Maybe you don't feel ready. Maybe you feel unworthy. Maybe you're unsure about your gifts. But if you've encountered the living God—even in small ways—then He's already begun to equip you. Let Isaiah and the seventy-two remind you: God still calls, still sends, and still fills ordinary lives with His extraordinary purpose.

The question isn't whether God is calling. He is.

The question is: Will you say, "Here I am—send me"?

Say yes. Go where you're sent.

Trust that God walks with you, works through you, and carries you when it gets hard.
