A message from Rev. Aaron Moad

Lord Teach Us to Pray

In this week's readings—1 Thessalonians 5:16–24 and Luke 11:1–13—we're invited into something deep and personal: a life of prayer. When the disciples come to Jesus and say, "Lord, teach us to pray," they're not just asking for words—they're asking how to stay connected to God in everyday life.

Paul, in his letter to the Thessalonians, says something similar: "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances." It might sound like a tall order, but it's not about being perfect. It's about staying open to God, moment by moment. Both of these passages show us that prayer isn't something we check off our to-do list. It's a way of living with God—honestly, daily, persistently.

Here are three simple but powerful reminders from these scriptures:

1. Prayer is about relationship, not performance.

When Jesus teaches the Lord's Prayer, it starts with "Father." That one-word changes everything. Prayer isn't about having the right words or sounding spiritual. It's about knowing who you're talking to—a loving, generous Father who cares for you.

Sometimes we put pressure on ourselves to pray "the right way." But Jesus shows us that what matters most is trust, not perfection. Just show up. Talk to God like you would talk to someone who loves you and wants what's best for you—because that's exactly who He is.

2. God invites us to keep asking—not because He's distant, but because He's close.

Jesus tells a story about someone knocking on a friend's door in the middle of the night, asking for help. It's a funny

picture, but His point is clear: Don't be afraid to keep asking, seeking, and knocking. God isn't bothered by our persistence—in fact, He welcomes it.

This doesn't mean we always get what we want, when we want it. But it *does* mean that God listens. And He gives us what we truly need—including the gift of His Spirit, His presence with us every step of the way.

3. A praying life is a joyful, grounded life.

Paul says, "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances." That doesn't mean we ignore pain or pretend everything's fine. It means we keep turning toward God—whether things are going great or falling apart.

When we stay connected to God in prayer, we find strength, peace, and even joy that doesn't depend on what is going on around us. Prayer helps us live with hope. It reminds us we're not alone, and that God is working, even when we can't see it yet.

So, what now?

Maybe your prayer life feels a little stuck. Maybe you've been asking and waiting, and you're tired. Or maybe you're just not sure how to start. That's okay.

Jesus doesn't say, "Pray perfectly." He says, "Ask."
He doesn't say, "Figure it all out." He says, "Seek."
He doesn't say, "Be worthy." He says, "Knock."
Start small. Be real. Keep showing up.
The One who calls you is faithful—and He's listening
